THREE DECADES OF GROUNDBREAKING DATA SHOW:

The Littles in our programs experience proven, positive results by having a solid mentor in their lives. Here are some key takeaways from the 2024 National Economic Impact Study:



Enhanced economic mobility: Youth who were in the program experienced a 15% boost in earnings between the ages of 20 and 25.



Higher postsecondary education attendance: Mentored youth are 20% more likely to enroll in postsecondary education compared to non-mentored peers.




Improved behavior: Within 18 months of being matched, mentored youth reported lower absenteeism and fewer school suspensions.








THE DATA SHOWS...

Gender: We need more male Bigs! A big push to recruit more men could help better match our male Littles.
Race: Our Bigs don't reflect the diversity of our Littles. A focus on recruiting a diverse range of mentors would help ensure Littles have relatable role models.
Age: Relying on high school Bigs could mean shorter matches. More adult mentors would could provide the consistency and stability all Littles need.
