

ECONOMIC IMPACT RESEARCH

BRINGING THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY TO LIFE

Big Brothers Big Sisters of America launches groundbreaking research on the long-term impacts of mentorship

This study completed by Harvard and the U.S. Department of Treasury reveals mentorship as a cost-effective solution to drive socioeconomic mobility for youth in Southwest Michigan and nationwide. Rooted in 30 years of data, the study provides evidence of greater enrollment in higher education, increased salaries, reduced dependency on social services, and improved behavioral outcomes for mentored youth.



MENTORSHIP CHANGES LIVES

• Now, we have national Big Brothers Big Sisters research that shows that a caring mentor impacts a young person's present and shapes their future for years to come.

The impact has a ripple effect on the economy and society.

MENTORING BENEFITS EVERYONE

• Littles are 20% more likely to pursue post-secondary education after high school graduation.



MENTORING POSITIVELY IMPACTS THE ECONOMY

- Littles enter the workforce earning more than their non-mentored peers.
- They experience 20% higher income between the ages of 20 and 25.
- Littles' income as adults is more closely aligned with the higher income of their Bigs than their family.

MENTORING PROGRAMS

Big Brothers Big Sisters' one-to-one mentoring programs are proven to help youth realize and own their potential.

COMMUNITY MENTORING

Mentor a child on your own or with your partner, sibling, or best friend as a Big Duo, or with your family as a Big Family. You and your Little can share everyday activities you already enjoy. Play a game or sport. Go on a hike. Read or draw. Visit a park or museum. Or just listen and nurture their inspiration. You can make a BIG impact in just two hours, twice per month.



HIGH SCHOOL/MIDDLE SCHOOL BIGS

This unique mentoring program provides value to High School/Middle School students (Bigs) by reinforcing social-emotional learning (SEL) competencies with their mentee (Little). They will meet at their Little's school during the Little's school day, at a standing day and time with support from their School Site Coordinator and their Mentoring Relationship Specialist.



SPORTS BUDDIES

Adult volunteers mentor youth who have a shared interest in sports, fitness, or just being active. Matches will meet 1–2 Saturdays per month for at least 6 months, gathering at BBBS-hosted events that include a mix of active and spectator sports. Sports Buddies is for everyone; mentors don't have to be athletes to make a BIG impact!



LUNCH WITH LITTLES

As a Big Brother, Big Sister, or Big Duo, you can mentor a child at their school or at a local community organization during the Little's school day or after-school. Read more about this program opportunity on the next page!

2025 BENEFIT DINNER SPEAKER



Greg Kampe; Head Coach, Men's Basketball - Oakland University

Completing his 41st season as Oakland University's men's basketball head coach, Greg Kampe has built a program synonymous with success, resilience, and community impact. Under his leadership, Oakland has claimed multiple recognitions including joining the 700+ win club in November; a feat that includes only 38 other head coaches in the NCAA, and 70 total head

coaches across all college athletic conferences.

Kampe's impact transcends wins. He has mentored NBA talents like Kendrick Nunn and Kay Felder, coached 18 consecutive first-team all-league players, and led his team to eight 20-win seasons and six Summit League championships. His commitment to excellence earned him induction into the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 2017.

Beyond the court, Kampe champions community service, raising over \$500,000 for cancer research and supporting initiatives like the Boys & Girls Club. For his dedication, he received the Sparky Anderson Community Excellence Award in 2016.

Guided by the mantra "Consistency is the hallmark of success," Kampe has transformed Oakland basketball into a national contender, with eight postseason berths and 32 professional players emerging under his tutelage. His coaching philosophy prioritizes student-athletes' growth, both on and off the court, ensuring they succeed beyond basketball.

From NCAA Tournament triumphs to his unwavering commitment to his players and community, Greg Kampe's legacy is a testament to the power of vision, dedication, and heart.






